Additional tips to consider

Here are some expanded notes on Audio and Video recording:

- If you want, you can check your camera settings in the settings on your phone/tablet and our recommendation is 720p, because anything bigger will take up tons of storage space on your device, and take forever to upload/download.
 - See this quick 30-second clip here in our drive for how to manage camera settings (on an iPhone, but this is probably similar on other smart devices).
- Do a test run first before you start class (potentially before students are there).
 - Set up the device you will use to record, make sure the framing will fit most of you and at least one of your students (we are not watching for their abilities, we are admiring your hardwork and role as an aspiring teacher!).
 - For the test run, hit record and then walk into the frame, speak some and do some movements to make sure it is recording for about 30 seconds. Then, watch that video replay to make sure it worked well.
 - Can we see you? Consider lighting and camera position for both standing and floor sequences.
 - Can we *hear* you? Consider background noise like music, fans, cars, echos, etc. It's important to be able to hear your voice above everything else.
 - Reminder, this is not about perfection, and we are for you, here to help in observing with encouragement and guidance on how you hold and engage the space you are in as the teacher.
 - Don't forget the record button you don't want to teach the class and discover at the end it wasn't recording!
- Upload your video to your YouTube Channel.
 - You're welcome to upload it as "unlisted" which will hide the video from the public while creating a sharable link. You will then share this link on your YTT Dashboard. Our leaders will review and share feedback with you within the week.
 - Uploading may take a while for a 60-minute video so please check your battery level when doing so!
